Reading Comprehension (40 points)

(A) There are limits to how many sports can be included in the Olympic Games. In the Summer Games, there were 26, and the International Olympic Committee (IOC) have added more for 2016 (golf and rugby sevens). There are various criteria that the IOC bases its decision but the most important is probably international popularity. sites weekly. Additionally, 50% of young people in the study mentioned that group chats have become an essential part of their work and academic conversations. These numbers highlight a

growing trend where online interactions control how this generation connects.

However, the study also reveals some disadvantages. Around 60% of respondents reported feeling addicted to their devices, with many describing the constant need to check notifications and comments as noisy. Additionally, 55% admitted that technology sometimes creates emotional distance in relationships, as digital interactions often lack the depth and personal touch of face-toface conversations.

Interestingly, 40% of young people expressed a desire to reduce screen time to focus more on real connections. Despite these concerns, 88% of respondents agreed that technology makes it easier

to keep relationships across distances and borders.

The findings underline a need for balance. While technology offers significant benefits, such as breaking physical barriers and enabling instant communication, it also presents negative effects on society and economy such as cybersecurity costs and job displacement. Encouraging young people to use technology wisely can help. And to get the benefits of technology without losing the personal touch of traditional communication, young people can do the followings: setting screen-time limits, prioritizing real interactions, and choosing deeper conversations over quick texts.
